GOOD FRIDAY REFLECTION

THE SEVEN LAST WORDS OF CHRIST

LUKE 22:66-71

Jesus before Pilate and Herod

⁶⁶ At daybreak the council of the elders of the people, both the chief priests and the teachers of the law, met together, and Jesus was led before them. ⁶⁷ "If you are the Messiah," they said, "tell us."

Jesus answered, "If I tell you, you will not believe me, ⁶⁸ and if I asked you, you would not answer. ⁶⁹ But from now on, the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the mighty God." ⁷⁰ They all asked, "Are you then the Son of God?" He replied, "You say that I am." ⁷¹ Then they said, "Why do we need any more testimony? We have heard it from his own lips."

LUKE 23:1

Then the whole assembly rose and led him off to Pilate.

LUKE 23:13-27

- ¹³ Pilate called together the chief priests, the rulers and the people, ¹⁴ and said to them, "You brought me this man as one who was inciting the people to rebellion. I have examined him in your presence and have found no basis for your charges against him. ¹⁵ Neither has Herod, for he sent him back to us; as you can see, he has done nothing to deserve death. ¹⁶ Therefore, I will punish him and then release him."
- ¹⁸ But the whole crowd shouted, "Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us!" ¹⁹ (Barabbas had been thrown into prison for an insurrection in the city, and for murder.)
- ²⁰ Wanting to release Jesus, Pilate appealed to them again. ²¹ But they kept shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" ²² For the third time he spoke to them: "Why? What crime has this man committed? I have found in him no grounds for the death penalty. Therefore I will have him punished and then release him." ²³ But with loud shouts they insistently demanded that he be crucified, and their shouts prevailed. ²⁴ So Pilate decided to grant their demand. ²⁵ He released the man who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, the one they asked for, and surrendered Jesus to their will. ²⁶ As the soldiers led him away, they seized Simon from Cyrene, who was on (.../over)

his way in from the country, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus. ²⁷ A large number of people followed him, including women who mourned and wailed for him.

LUKE 23:32-24

³² Two other men, both criminals, were also led out with him to be executed. ³³ When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him there, along with the criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. ³⁴ Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." And they divided up his clothes by casting lots.

REFLECTION

ONE: It's true, they do not know what they are doing...

...it hurts so much. I never imagined such pain. Father, please help me.

LUKE 23:35-43

³⁵ The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is God's Messiah, the Chosen One." ³⁶ The soldiers also came up and mocked him. They offered him wine vinegar ³⁷ and said, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself." ³⁸ There was a written notice above him, which read: THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS. ³⁹ One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" ⁴⁰But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? ⁴¹ We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong." ⁴² Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.^{[a]"} ⁴³ Jesus answered him, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise."

REFLECTION

ONE: Someone believes in me. What a difference that makes...

...I am not sure I understand the reason myself, you do, and with that I must be satisfied.

JOHN 19:25-27

²⁵ Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶ When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, "Woman, ^[a] here is your son," ²⁷ and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.

REFLECTION

ONE: There are others who believe in me too. These women, so faithful right to the end...

...if they can teach and live the things you taught me, Father, then perhaps I won't have died in vain.

MATTHEW 27:45-47

⁴⁵ From noon until three in the afternoon darkness came over all the land. ⁴⁶ About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"). ⁴⁷ When some of those standing there heard this, they said, "He's calling Elijah."

REFLECTION

ONE: I am alone. I am so alone. My disciples have deserted me....

...God has abandoned me. I am nothing.

JOHN 19:28-29

²⁸ Later, knowing that everything had now been finished, and so that Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." ²⁹ A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips.

REFLECTION

ONE: It is only sour wine that they gave me, and yet somehow it revives my soul just a little.....may my sacrifice bring your forgiveness to all those in need.

JOHN 19:30

³⁰ When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

REFLECTION

ONE: There is nothing more I can do. I have given everything I have to give... ...now I must live out my own words and die for my beliefs.

LUKE 23:44-49

⁴⁴ It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, ⁴⁵ for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. ⁴⁶ Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." ^[a] When he had said this, he breathed his last. ⁴⁷ The centurion, seeing what had happened, praised God and said, "Surely this was a righteous man." ⁴⁸ When all the people who had gathered to witness this sight saw what took place, they beat their breasts and went away. ⁴⁹ But all those who knew him, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things.

REFLECTION

ONE: You are here. I feel your presence surrounding me, just as I felt you so often throughout my life......may they know that even as you have been with me this day, you are with them in their times of pain and suffering and sorrow. We are not alone.

CLOSING PRAYER

ONE: Gracious God, as we depart from here this most solemn of days, help us to reflect upon what we have seen and heard, and to take to ourselves what you have done for us this day.

ALL: Make us a people of faith and courage in order that we might find our way through these dark hours, as we await the rising of your Son on Easter morning. Amen.
